To cope up with the ever increasing numbers of students the college has initiated the process of inviting a study centre of Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University from the forthcoming session.

- The college has been maintained as a pollution free zone. Annual plantation drive has been performed with the budget provided by the college to make it a pollution free zone. The black boards have been replaced with the white boards to make the class rooms dust free.
